All entries must be staged $\&$ all entrants are required to vacate the Pavilion by 10.30 am Friday $17^{\text {th }}$ November 2023. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- All exhibits must remain on display until 4pm Saturday $18^{\text {th }}$ November 2023
- Exhibits must be collected between 4.15pm - 6.30pm Saturday $18^{\text {th }}$ November 2023 or between 10am -2 pm Sunday $19^{\text {th }}$ November 2023. Please bring your entry receipt for collection.
